Risk assessment :- HI 271 Rev 01 Covid-19

Covid-19 is an illness that has been well publicised and documented over the past year and is a respiratory illness, this is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. There has now been a UK wide vaccination programme initiated which will reduce the severity of the symptoms once administered, the symptoms can be a new continuous cough, a high temperature and a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).
